Mission Statement:

"To serve all citizens collectively and individually by responding to all dispatched emergencies in a timely and safe fashion, and to care for all patients to the level of our training and the best of our ability."

History:

Glenwood City Ambulance Service was originally started in 1972. The first ambulance cost \$10,000 and was purchased with the help of a \$5,000 grant. It was a converted 5-seat window van and was housed in the old fire hall on Main Street. In October 1999, a new Fire/EMS station was constructed at its current location on Misty Lane across from the high school.

Glenwood City Ambulance serves approximately 126 square miles in portions of Dunn County as well as St. Croix County including the City of Glenwood City, Town of Glenwood, Village of Downing, and sections of the Town of Emerald, Springfield and Forest. We are situated on the border between Dunn and St. Croix Counties and thus respond to 911 calls in both counties. We also have been assisting Boyceville Ambulance with their calls as they are short staffed and undergoing many changes within their service.

Our greatest challenge is to stay within our budgetary limits. It is difficult as a small, rural service to keep up with the changes mandated at the state level which is the reason for this grant application. We started our Ambulance Association 2 years ago to help us with necessary funding as a 501(c) (3). We utilize the association and its funds to do positive things within our community and to assist us with securing grant money for required equipment replacement. We have been an active member of our community since 1972 and continuously work at getting out and making ourselves visible to our residents. You will see in the next section just a few of the things we do and the Ambulance Association helps support us and allows us to do many of the things our current ambulance budget would not support.

As with other small services, acquiring and retaining crew members in a rural area is always a struggle. Low pay is the key issue for us but we manage to staff our service 24/7. When the state decides to make required changes as they have now made that mandate emergency services to upgrade all their emergency radios, it puts an incredible drain on us. Again, this is where our Association comes in. We are reaching out to find help funding the replacement of our mobile radios in both ambulances and our portable radios that each EMT carries on them for communication purposes. If only a portion of our mobile radio in this request is approved, it is still a huge win for us as we navigate this challenge.

2. Current Initiatives*

Each year we get out into our community and help with projects, fundraise, educate our kids at school on who we are and what we do as well as support community activities. A few examples are:

**Annual "Egg Your Yard" fundraiser that has us hiding candy filled eggs (per requests) in peoples yards. We do this Friday night and Saturday night prior to Easter so when kids wake in the morning or arrive for Easter at Grandma's, the yard is full of bright colorful eggs for them to find

**National Night Out is a great night for community members to come out, meet emergency services, enjoy several activities, see Life Link helicopter up close and have a free picnic supper

**We escort our high school athletes out of town and back in after all events they have attended at the state level

**Our crew volunteers to go into the school, hand out stickers, talk with the kids and help service their lunch to them

**An annual coloring contest is held for our elementary students with trophy's for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place in each age grouping

**We attend family night within our community where kids can see our trucks and ask questions

**Community parade along with a copious amount of candy!

**Home football games are covered in the event there is an injury

**We attend Trunk or Treat each year that is held at our local church and hosted by our community club

**Of course we must take time to thank our crew members for their commitment and dedication to our service. Each spring we hold a supper in their honor

This is just a portion of what our Ambulance and the Association does for our community and our crew members. The community members are always grateful and seem to enjoy seeing us out and about within our service area as much as they do. We can't wait to expand into the school more to try and peak students interests in the medical field

3. Organizational Structure*

We started our Ambulance Association 2 years ago to help us fund extra activities within our community and surrounding service area. Our daily functions include looking for grants to help us replace our current emergency radios as we are required to upgrade them. We are also continually looking for fun activities to offer for our community members and ways to get out and be an active presence in our community. We work diligently as a group to decide how we can use the donations we receive for the betterment of our service and/or the community.

As a 501(c)(3), we have a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Our Ambulance Director and Co-Director also take an active role within the association giving input and guidance on what would be most beneficial for our service. By starting the Association, we have a direct impact on our service's needs. After all, our crew knows best what our service's needs are. We, of course, abide by the strict guidelines of being a 501(c)(3) and complete our annual 990-N report each year.

About the Grant

What is the community need that this request addresses?*

The community need with this grant request is to keep our residents and visitors to our community, as well as others in our service area, safe. Safety is of the utmost concern during emergencies. Not only for our citizens but for our crew. When the new radio program takes effect in approximately 2 years, we need to be ready for it no matter what. Our current radios will not be able to communicate with our 911 dispatcher or police. That could potentially set us up for potentially life altering outcomes. If our ambulance crew needs extra help, a paramedic to respond or a Life Link/Mayo One helicopter, we need quick access to have contact with them. Our crew could also be put in danger in the event the scene we're at becomes unsafe. Without access to dispatch and police, who are our lifeline when we are on scene, the entire call could become deadly. We have more instances of mental health issues than we have in the past and unfortunately the presence of guns and knives have become more prevalent. Our community, like all others, depend on us as EMT's to respond quickly and efficiently and treat them to the best of our ability in the pre-hospital setting. Medical emergencies are stressful enough for both EMT's and patients without adding another factor into the mix that leaves us without direct communication with our peers. As I stated, we have approximately 2 years to make this transition. We have not been given an exact date we will be going live but we have been assured that it is going to happen and the St. Croix County board has approved it. While we understand the impact it is going to have financially on services, we cannot pass that expense on to our citizens who expect, and deserve, the best we can offer in their time of need.

Project Goals and Activities*

St. Croix County is following along with other counties in the state of WI to upgrade/update their radio systems. Because of this, every EMS service as well as fire departments and police are required to upgrade their portable and mobile radios. This isn't something that a small service with a very small budget such as ours can handle so we are reaching out to grant opportunities such as yours to hopefully allow us to get a couple radios here and a couple radios there. We are asking for 1 mobile radio for our ambulance with this

grant application. If we can keep plugging away at this, hopefully by the time this upgrade is enacted, we can have what we need on our service.

Our department needs this equipment because if we stay with the radios we currently have, we will not be able to have contact directly with St. Croix County Dispatch or with police officers. It is vital that we continue to have that contact to provide safety for our crew members as well as our patients. We never know what will present itself at any particular scene. Many times, everything is calm and fine but other times, we are met with scenes that are not safe upon our arrival or become unsafe after we get on scene. Direct communication is vital. We are not particularly happy about having to purchase new encrypted radios, but our hands are tied and the county has made it clear, this is a requirement.

Once we secure money for a specific radio, we then have our sales representative order it per the quote he has supplied to us. Once the radio arrives, they program it and install it for us to meet the new specifications provided by the county.

The new radios will have encryption thus preventing people from eavesdropping on emergency communications via scanners. While we understand the importance of this, it does put a very real financial bind especially on small services. Anticipated Challenges*

At this time, we are trying to stay positive but with a huge financial burden hanging over our heads, it is frustrating. Everything in the medical field is so expensive and it creates a daily battle to keep current with life-saving equipment, the expenses associated with them and the cost to fix them in the event they break down.

We need to replace 8 portable radios at a total cost of \$26,160.00 and 2 mobile radios at a cost of \$12,547.36 for a total of \$38,707.36

Emergency radios are our lifeline to provide a safety net not only to our crew members, but to our patients for their safety and well-being in the pre-hospital setting
As you can see, this is huge undertaking!

As far as funding and sustainability, the funding portion is still up in the air. We will continue to try and raise funds through grants to assist us in this endeavor. We will continue to apply for grants to help us succeed with radio replacement. The portion that is not covered by grants, will have to be funded by the City of Glenwood City through a loan and a portion may possibly have to be passed on to the area townships we serve. Our budget can sustain 3-4 radios but cannot cover the remaining expenses. In the end, if we cannot fulfill replacing all our portable radios we will have to get by without all crew members having a portable radio on them and readily available.
